Quality Parish Council Status Award

While the World Pea Shooting Championships were in full flow, the council was awarded Quality Parish Council Status.

A certificate was presented to council chairman, Ashley Bamforth, by Denis Payne from Cambridge and Peterborough Association of Local Councils.

Mr Bamforth said: "Only five per cent of parish councils throughout the country received this award, so it's a remarkable achievement. The award recognises the hard work that has been done to improve communication with the electorate. We regularly distribute newsletters to houses and always give 15 minutes' free time before council meetings for the public to ask questions about items on the agenda.

"We've worked incredibly hard to achieve this award and it now means that we will have better access to grants that become available."
